- For one night only, on 3 April, UK stand-up sensation Fern Brady will be in conversation with Laura Davis to discuss how her experiences with religion, homelessness and a late diagnosis of autism inspired her bestselling book Strong Female Character. Presented in partnership with the Melbourne International Comedy Festival.
- **Dervla McTiernan** will travel to Ballarat and Geelong to to discuss her suspenseful new novel What Happened to Nina?
